Middlings commonly have a comfortable standard of living, considerable economic security, moderate work + life autonomy and often rely on their own expertise to sustain themselves.


They place great emphasis on independence, value innovation, respect the non-conformist and have great concerns for the environment. They appear established and well rounded but often have insecurities locked within.

This is a fictional book. If you find any similarities of yourself in this book, it is purely out of coincidence or a result of the author's daydreams.


Or you could just be one serious fellow middling.







Over time, Haee becomes restless with the comfortable routine and decides to venture out of home.




He gets to know some cats in a back alley behind the neighbourhood.






But Haee is not bothered by Whie's big red nose. In fact, Haee finds Whie really special and interesting.




Whie has an unusual eating habit. She refuses to kill another living being for food.






While other cats hunt for lizards, rats, roaches and grasshoppers, Whie eats the left over pizzas in the back alley.






She finishes the left over pizzas in the alley, leaving nothing to the lizards, rats and roaches.
