

## Champagnes....

- 1. Ayala, Brut Majeur, NV Ay** **£40.00**  
The Brut Majeur Non Vintage is made up of 40% Pinot Noir, 27% Chardonnay and 33% Pinot Meunier, blended by chef de cave Nicholas Kylv who has personally hand-crafted the wines of Ayala for the past 30 years. Owned by the House of Bollinger **125ml £6.75**
- 2. Gosset Brut Excellence, NV** **£60.00**  
This lively cuvée offers subtle floral and fruity aromas, followed by further rich and complex notes. The palate is fresh and delicate throughout. A perfect match for a variety of dishes from saltwater fish, chicken or duck.
- 3. Louis Roederer, Brut Premier NV** **£47.50**  
Louis Roederer are one of only four privately owned Grand marque Champagne house left in Reims. All of their fruit comes from family owned vineyards and the wine is aged for at least 3 years (the minimum by law is fifteen months)  
The result is beautifully balanced champagne of great style and finesse.
- 4. Verve Clicquot, Yellow Label, Brut, Reims NV** **£55.00**  
Fuller and richer than many non vintage champagnes. **125ml £9.95**  
Hints of warm bread and citrus on the nose with a refined, exquisitely balanced palate.
- 5. Bollinger, Special Cuvee NV Ay** **£60.00**  
The Flagship of the Bollinger range this wine embodies the house style. The champagne has a delicate yet complex nose, with hints of citrus fruit and a balanced palate.
- 6. Ruinart, Blanc du Blanc NV** **£80.00**  
100 % Chardonnay  
Fine, light bubbles. Delicate Chardonnay grapes give it an instantly recognisable golden yellow colour. On the palate, it develops a fresh, supple roundedness.
- 7. ¼ bottles Moet and Chandon, Champagne** **£17.00**  
Rosé Impérial is a seductive champagne with coppery shades and fruity liveliness. The Pinot Noir brings flavors of ripe, red berries and a supple, creamy finish.

## Vintage

- 8. Gosset Grand Millesime, Vintage 2000** **£100.00**  
The Gosset Grand 2000 vintage is a celebration of the prestigious champagne house. Assembled to create a clear blend, it all comes together in a pale yellow dress, made lively and adorable by tints of green. 56% Grand Cru Chardonnay and 44% Pinot Black (Premier Cru) goes into this delectable offering – one which makes excellent use of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century's final harvest.
- 9. Louis Roederer, Cristal, Vintage 2004** **£250.00**  
Demand for this most prestige of prestige cuvee has never been greater.  
Distinguished extravagance Possibly the greatest Champagne in the world.
- 10. Dom Perignon Vintage 2002** **£ 150.00**  
A blend of over 50 different crus gives the wine richness. The dominance of the Pinot Noir grape bring vitality And lasting flavour. The Chardonnay produces a lightness and provides both sharpness and delicacy

## Rose Champagne

**11. Ayala Majeur, Rose NV £45.00**

Founded in 1860, and one of the original Grande Marque houses, Ayala has been creating **125ml £7.50**

Champagnes of superb style and finesse for over two centuries. Ayala, based in the brilliant village of Aÿ (hence the name), is a brand going through nothing short of a ballistic improvement in quality, thanks to the new owners Bollinger - also residents of this stellar village.

**12. Bollinger, Rose NV £65.00**

This is the first time Bollinger have produced a Non Vintage Rose and it's a Treat. Red cherries & raspberries mingle on the deep, inviting nose. The palate displays vibrancy & further red fruit notes but with a dark twist.

**13. Ruinart Rose NV Bottles £65.00**  
**14. Ruinart Rose NV Half Bottles £35.00**

A blend of 45 % premier cru Chardonnay and 55% Pinot Noir. This is the original "dumpy bottle Rose" now available in half bottle. A fine, fresh fruity wine, very smooth, ample and subtle. Notes of passion fruits enhanced with a hint of spice. A champagne full of elegance and distinction

**15. Laurent Perrier Rose NV £70.00**

Deep pink- salmon, with very fine bubbles. Bright, fresh and intense, with notes of raspberries, strawberries and black cherries. Full of fresh fruit. Bench mark Rose.

## Vintage Rose

**16. Moët & Chandon Grand Vintage Rose £100.00**

The wines are fine, clear and expressive. 30% Chardonnay, 50% Pinot Noir and 20% Pinot Meunier of a medium gold colour with hazelnut and coffee aromas, complimented by delicate lime and ripe wheat shades with a wonderful roundness and balance, built on delicacy and vivacity. The full bodied nature of this wine compliments chicken pates, scallops, fish dishes and creamed meats and caramelised fruit tart.

**17. Krug Rose**

From a blend of 50% Pinot Noir, 30% Chardonnay and 20% Pinot Meunier, this refined rosé with clean **£270.00** summer fruit and exceptional length, is about as good as rosé gets.

## Prosecco

**18. Prosecco, Fabiano, Italy £25.00**

A light and fruity sparkling wine made from 100% Prosecco grapes in Friuli. With delicious notes **125ml £5.00** of apple, pear and citrus fruits, it's excellent well-chilled on its own but equally scrumptious with appetisers or a fresh fruit salad.

**19. Prosecco, Fabiano Rose Italy £28.00**

A light and fruity sparkling wine made from 100% Prosecco grapes in Friuli. With delicious notes **125ml £5.50** of apple, pear and citrus fruits, it's excellent well-chilled on its own but equally scrumptious with appetisers or a fresh fruit salad.

## Whites Selection .....

### 20. Kintu, Sauvignon Blanc, Chile

£3.25 £16.00

This wine shows a bright yellow—green colour. The nose is elegant with dominant notes of flower Exquisitely mixed with herbal tones. In mouth, the wine is crisp, fresh round and well balanced with a long finish.

### 21. Laroma, Pinot Grigio, Italy

£3.50 £17.00

Delicate on the palate with lightly honeyed fruit balanced by lemony acidity and a fresh, dry finish. The wine has gentle floral and citrus aromas.

### 22. Boars Kloof, Chenin Blanc, South Africa

£3.75 £18.00

Fruity, crisp and well-balanced wine with combinations of tropical, guava and apple flavours. The combination of residual sugar and balanced acidity give the wine a clean and crisp palate with a lingering aftertaste.

### 23. Louis Latour, Grand Ardeche, Chardonnay, France

£4.25 £25.00

After 12 months ageing in small oak barrels, this wine – made from 100% Chardonnay– Displays fresh, rich fruit flavours, with the extra dimension added by the judicious oak ageing.

### 24. Dr Loosen, Riesling, Germany

£4.25 £25.00

This is a very typical Riesling from the Mosel characterised by a fragrant nose with a hint of honey and green Apricot fruit, all of which follow through on the off-dry palate.

### 25. Muscadet de Sevre et Maine, Sur Lie, Langlois-Château, Loire France

£28.00

This Muscadet de Sèvres et Maine, matured on the lees, is top of the range thanks to its exceptional Terroirs and a dedicated vinification method. More body, more character, more complex.

### 26. Mud House, Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand

£29.50

Marlborough has one of the longest ripening periods in the world, this combined With long summer days and cold nights produce wines of great finesse.

### 27. Gavi 'La Battistina', Piemonte, Italy

£30.00

Aromatic, zesty nose with apple, lime and kiwi notes and a hint of minerality. Juicy, weighty fruit with a zippy, citric acid mouth watering feel creating a refreshing, satisfying finish.

## Rose Selection.....

### 28. Old Station, White Zinfandel, USA

£3.50 £16.50

A delicate salmon - pink, medium wine that has been made using a very short Maceration of the Zinfandel grapes after pressing.

### 29. Ancora, Chiaretto Rosé Barbera, Pinot Grigio, Italy

£3.50 £16.50

Bright strawberry pink hue. Delicately aromatic with wild strawberry fruit characters. Light and crisp on the palate with ripe fruit balanced by tangy acidity.

### 30. Cotes du Provence , Henri Gaillard, Provence, France

£24.00

The southern French coast has a reputation for being the rose capitol of the world. These wines are not to be confused with the sweet white zinfandels of the USA.

### 31. Domaine Ott Chateau de Provence, Provence, France

£60.00

Hand picking, extremely selective sorting and delicate pressing of the grapes and then finally maturing in oak barrels our just some of the reasons why this wine has the reputation for being the 'finest rose in the world'.

## Red Selection

**32. Kintu, Merlot, Chile**

£3.25 £16.00

The wine has an intense violet colour dominated by mature red fruits, herbal and spicy aromas. In the mouth, it has a medium body, with rounded tannins, combining it lovely fruitiness with interesting notes of pepper chocolate.

**33. Broken Back , Shiraz, Australia**

£3.50 £18.50

The wine is vibrant and fruity with good palate structure and depth. It has aromas of raspberry and cherry with underlying spices and an integrated oak finish.

**34. Alma Mora, Malbec, Argentina**

£3.75 £19.00

Deep ruby red with violet hues and aromas of fresh red fruits - plums and cherries – and a hint of oak. On the palate are typical varietal flavours of red fruits and vanilla with some floral nuances and ripe tannins. The finish is long & elegant.

**35. Rochberg, Pinotage, South Africa**

£3.75 £19.00

Rich, alluvial soils and a mild climate with coastal influences create an ideal wine grape growing environment. Aromas of prune, blackberries, nut and a little mint, with a palate of bold berry fruits, soft tannins and a good length.

**36. Louis Latour, Pinot Noir, Var, France**

£4.25 £28.00

A fabulous wine from the Var region, north of St. Tropez. This wine has a light ruby colour and an elegant perfumed bouquet. The palate is rich and smooth with a distinctive red berry fruit character.

**37. Cerro Anon, Rioja Crianza, Spain**

£28.00

Made from 100% Tempranillo, this wine spends 12 months in new fine grain American Oak and over 6 months aging in the bottle.

**38. Mc Henry Hohnan, Margret River, Shiraz, Margret River, Australia**

£29.50

Medium bodied with gentle, ripe tannins and a rounded finish The fruit is rich and earthy with rounded plum and bramble fruit supported by farm yardy characters and herbal hints. A restrained red that bears well with grilled and roasted meats and game.

**39. The Pepper Pot, Syrah 46% Mouvedre 46% Tannat 8%, Stellenbosch, South Africa**

£29.50

Made from grown grapes only in the Stellenbosch region, this wine is created to show the fresh, fruity and spice driven flavours of these Rhone varietals. The colour is youthful and purple/red.

The nose is one of crushed black pepper, dark mulberry and mixed berry coulis.

Pure, clean dark red berry flavours flow onto a smooth palate

## Premier Selection

### Whites

**40. Chablis, 1<sup>er</sup> Cru, France** **£40.00**

The epitome of Premier Cru Chablis: vivid and intense, with excellent mineral flavours and a long finish.

**41. Pouilly Fume, Domaine Minet, Loire, France** **£40.00**

Slow, cool fermentation with skin contact and some of the best sites in the region help to produce a Sancerre of intensity with rich mineral flavours and a long subtle finish.

**42. Marqués de Murrieta, Capellanía, White Rioja, Spain** **£45.00**

RiojaCapellanía is made solely from Viura grapes from our Capellanía vineyard, a 50-year-old plot located at the highest altitude of the 741-acre (300-hectare) Ygay Estate in Rioja Alta. The grapes are pressed in the traditional horizontal basket press and aged for almost two years in 225-liter new French oak barrels. A deep golden colour, its complex aroma and rich taste are the hallmarks of this world famous white wine.

**43. Domaine Schlumberger Gewurztraminer, Alsace, France** **£50.00**

The 'Prince Abbles' selection is named after the Abbots who checked the vintage every year when the vineyards belonged to the church. Gewurztraminer is the most celebrated grape variety of Alsace, spicy and aromatic this wine is perfect with Oriental cuisine.

**44. Mud House The Woolshed Vineyard Premium Sauvignon Blanc** **£50.00**

The fruit for this wine was solely sourced from the hillside blocks of Mud House's Marlborough Vineyard. The 4 small blocks were harvested together in the cool of the night. The freshly harvested grapes were then carefully transported to the winery for immediate pressing with minimal skin contact. The pressed juice was then cold settled before being cool fermented in stainless steel. Carefully selected yeasts were used to add complexity to the blend and to retain the fresh fruit characteristics from each of the blocks.

After the completion of fermentation the wine was carefully balanced and prepared for bottling. The nose has lifted notes of passionfruit, grapefruit and blackcurrant bud and a harmonious palate with rich fruit concentration.

The tropical flavours blend perfectly with the fresh green bean and citrus notes which all lead to a long elegant finish.

## Premier Selection.....

### Reds

- 45. Mud House, Pinot Noir, Marlborough, New Zealand** **£30.00**  
Sweet lifted aromas of cherries and plums, with a hint of currants. Attractive floral notes also appear integrated with savoury mushroom and toasty oak.
- 46. Del Fino Del Mundo Reserve, Malbec, Argentina** **£35.00**  
Deep red colour with hints of violet, floral aroma with fruity touches of plums and blackberries, and reminiscence of chocolate, vanilla and coconut. On the palate this wine is big, pleasant, balanced and full-bodied, with a long aftertaste. Elegant wine. 12 months aging (70 % in French oak barrels – 30% in American oak barrels). Can be enjoyed now or has ageing potential of up to 7 years.
- 47. Marques de Murrieta Tinto, Reserva, Spain** **£40.00**  
Aged in American Oak Barrels for 2- 3 years and another 2 years in bottle Marques de Murrieta Reserva is the essence of Rioja. The results are a silky smooth wine with subtle well integrated oak flavours and great elegance.
- 48. Chateau Peymouton, Saint Emilion, Grand Cru, France** **£55.00**  
Aromas of blackcurrants and redcurrants with a touch of spice and vanilla. Powerful with firm fruit flavours balanced with fine woody tannins. Elegant with a lingering finish
- 49. Amarone La Colombaia, Italy** **£60.00**  
Typical aromas of ripe fruit, fruit preserve and cherry are immediately perceived on first olfactory examination. Particularly striking is the incredible long length that lingers on the palate, when the wine displays all its strength through a warm and elegant body.

**50. Mud House, Golden Terrace Vineyard, Central Otago, Premium Pinot Noir 2010** **£50.00**

A single vineyard wine, the fruit was sourced from Mud Houses Bendigo Vineyard in Central Otago.

Harvest in our Bendigo vineyard commenced with perfect conditions. The grapes were hand picked between 27th March and 5th April. At the winery the clusters were gently de-stemmed into open fermenters.

After a five day cold soak the must was allowed to warm and commence fermentation un-inoculated.

The fermenting must was hand plunged 2-3 times a day to extract the colour, flavour and tannin structure.

After fermentation the must was pressed into a mix of new and used French oak barrels.

## *Dessert Wines By the Glass*

- 51. Anakena, Single Vineyard Late Harvest Viognier & Muscat, Chile** **£9.50**  
The Viognier & Muscat of Alexandria have been blended to produce this complex and elegant wine. Intense yellow gold in colour its exhibits notes of almonds, walnuts, and delicate tones of honey.
- 52. J. Vidal– Fleury, Muscat de Beaumes de Venise, France** **£14.50**  
The over ripe grapes are slowly macerated and fermented until the process is halted By the addition of alcohol from the same grape that kills of the yeasts and retains the residual sugars The resultant wine is a glittering gold colour with honey and apricot scented, citrusy aromas backed up by a clean, vibrant freshness on the palate.
- 53. Margan, Vineyard Botrytis Semillon, Australia** **£13.00**  
A bouquet of intense honeyed apricot and fig. Rich fruit fills the palate complimented by soft oak,

## *Port Selection*

- 54. Ramos Pinto, Reserva Collector, Portugal** **50ml**  
**£3.00**  
One wine up from standard Ruby Port, Collector is a blend of old and new vintages creating a 5 year old blend with a sense of power, fruit and red berries. A delightful wine that can be enjoyed in the mid afternoon, slightly chilled in hotter weather or as a stunning accompaniment to chocolate puddings !!!
- 55. Ramos Pinto, Late Bottled Vintage, Portugal** **£4.50**  
LBV comes from one single year and one single harvest. Whereas its richer cousin, the Vintage, is bottled in the second, this wine is bottled in the fourth year. Smoother than the Vintage, more developed, easier to drink its a powerful, defiant , full bodied and harmonious wine.
- 56. Ramos Pinto, Quinta de Ervamoira, 10 year old Tawny Port, Portugal** **£7.50**  
Red Brick in colour, with a palate of oriental spices, this multi award winning Tawny Port has spent the majority of its aging time spent in oak which oxygenates the wine to give it a lighter, warmer more feminine style
