Patrick Hollingworth is a normal, everyday person from the flattest state in Australia, who leads a double life as a highly accomplished high-altitude mountaineer.

Having decided early on that a life half-lived is a life wasted, Patrick pursued his love of the mountains and ultimately committed himself to an unguided ascent of the world's highest mountain. After a decade of hard work and perseverance, his dream was achieved on May 17th 2010.

Standing on the summit of Mount Everest confirmed his suspicion that it is only when we move outside of our comfort zones – when we truly stretch ourselves – that we find out who we really are. What Patrick discovered is that you *find* yourself at the Edge.

Obsessed with sharing this discovery with others, he founded a practice that shares this message through the delivery of keynote presentations, training workshops and outdoor

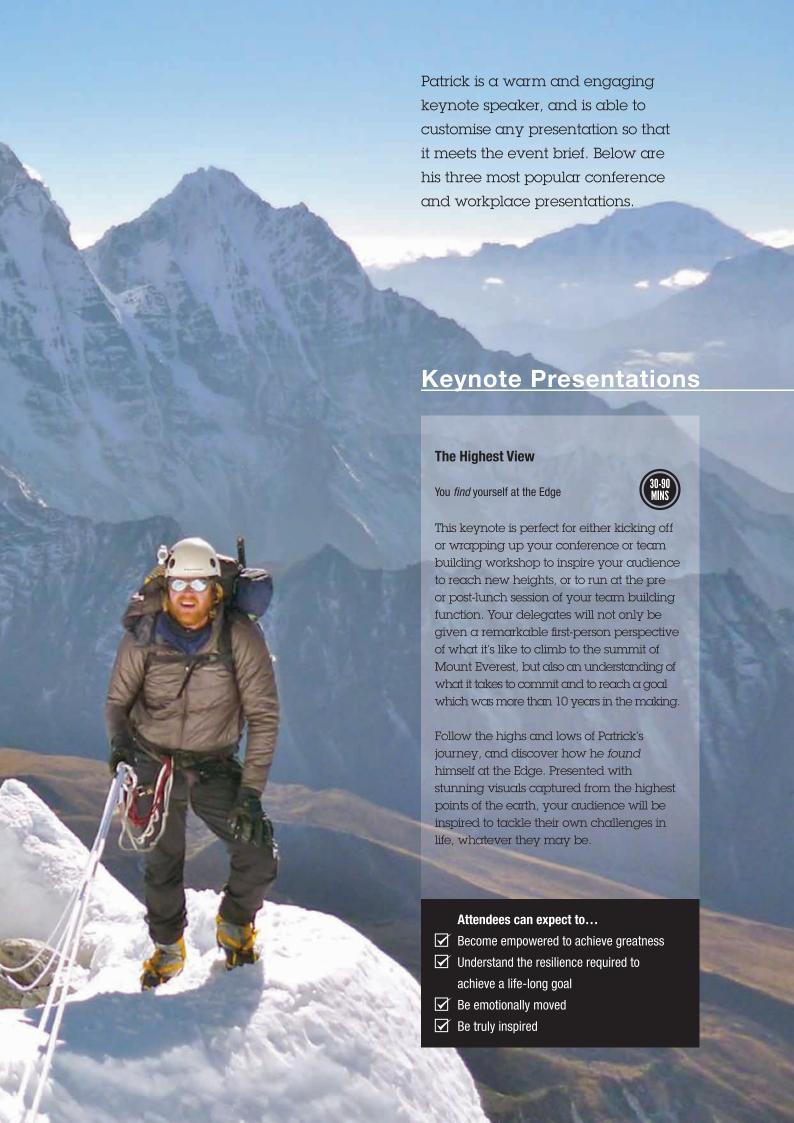
leadership programs. The key themes covered include:

Patrick is still an active climber, and as well as conducting leadership and team engagement activities in the Australian outdoors, he regularly leads expeditions to the Himalayas and further afield. Learn to lead outside of the comfort zone

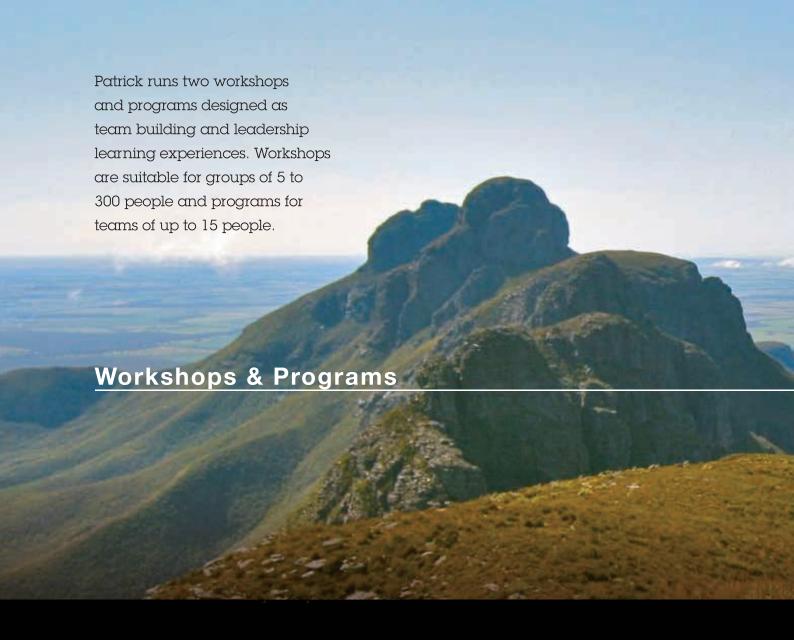

This presentation is designed to inspire and give audiences some practical take-home learnings.

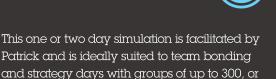

Operation: Climb Mount Everest provides a unique opportunity for your team-building event by setting the participants the thrilling challenge of climbing Mount Everest.

In this workshop participants will be tasked with the goal of selecting a leader and team of climbers, working to a budget, gathering route and weather information, and undertaking the climb. The team's success depends on their ability to manage risk and adapt to the changing environment as they move higher up the mountain, facing a number of difficult challenges along the way. This workshop has been filmed by Patrick entirely within the Himalayas using HD hand held cameras and head cams - the footage has to be seen to be believed!

Mini Expedition: Leadership and Teamwork at the Edge

Plan and execute a 3-day expedition to the Stirling Ranges



This extended program is designed for leaders and teams who are serious about fostering committed and highly effective leadership and team cultures. Patrick facilitates and guides this program, which has two main components. The first is in-house and takes place over a number of months, involving every team member playing an important role in preparing across four key areas (leadership and teamwork theory, risk management, logistics and physical training).

The second component involves three days of hiking through the Stirling Ranges and culminates in a 300m abseil descent of Bluff Knoll!

This is a physically and mentally demanding program that requires a full commitment from

all members at the onset. Participants will be challenged beyond their expectations, but the outcomes speak for themselves. Previous participants have proclaimed this to be the best team building exercise, ever.

Teams can expect to...

- Seriously align engagement and commitment towards a common goal
- Critically examine how members interact and make decisions under pressure
- Cement trust & rapport between members that extends far beyond the duration of the program
