Annex 1- Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions are in accordance as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014 or as may be amended from time to time.

No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence.

- (a)** At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
- (b)** At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:

- (a)** a holographic mark or
- (b)** an ultraviolet feature.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1

(a) "Duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) "Permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula
 $P = D + (DXV)$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "Relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence

(i) The holder of the premises licence

(ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “Value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph **(b)** of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph **(2)** applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph **(b)** of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2-Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

1. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised Local Authority or Police Officer, which will record the following:
 - a) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol and reason for refusal.
 - b) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
 - c) Any Crimes taken place at the premises.
2. The DPS shall ensure that all staff are delivered regular training, and on underage sales and on Challenge 25 scheme.
3. The delivery of alcohol will not be made to a person in a public place such as a street corner, park or bus stop etc.
4. The delivery of alcohol to be made only to a residential or business address, where it is evident that the customer is a resident or occupies the business.
5. Any Delivery of Alcohol must be paid prior to the delivery.
6. No collections of Alcohol by members of the public from the premises.
7. The premises must ensure that noise generating activity in relation to production of Alcohol, and noise from deliveries to the premises, take place between the hours of 8am and 7pm, so as not to cause a disturbance to local residents.
